ACRC TRAINING

We did loose a couple of aircraft and had a handful of airplanes that needed some sort of repair. As instructors we do everything we can to prevent damage or loss of an aircraft during the training process but as we all know, sometimes things happen. Thanks to Andy Thunstrom, John Sager, Bob Moser and all who donated their time this year. I anticipate another busy season next year.

Training Tips

In the last training tips article I covered the "forward slip" which is used when set up for a landing approach with excessive height or must descend rapidly without a large increase in airspeed. This month I will cover the "side slip." A sideslip may be used exclusively to remain lined up with a runway centerline while on approach in a crosswind. To perform a sideslip, roll the airplane, using aileron toward the wind to maintain runway centerline position while maintaining heading on the centerline with opposite rudder. Sideslip causes the upwind main landing gear to touch down first, followed by the downwind main gear. This allows the wheels to be aligned with the runway.
