#### RULE REMINDER

11. ALL AIRCRAFT MUST BE STARTED FACING THE RUNWAY. High RPM run-ups will not be made in the pits. The pits are defined as the west half of the area between the spectator area and the fence. The aircraft should be moved to the area between the pits and the fence for high RPM run-ups and needle valve adjustments. Run-ups are prohibited directly behind pilots.

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POWERED MODELS MUST BE RESTRAINED IN SOME WAY, EITHER BY A HELPER OR MECHANICALLY. Updated (3/20/14)

## **ACRC INSTRUCTION**

Wednesday training is going well. We have a total of 10 training at this time. All but two are current ACRC club members.

A special thank you to Neil Olson for his donated SIG LT-40 Trainer.

Also thank you to all those that have stepped up and donated planes, parts, engines etc. to the 2018 flight training program.

Don't forget the time donated by the flight instructors that bring the program all together.

#### **PREFLIGHT:**

Let's not forget to run a preflight before taking to the air. It's like flight insurance!

Landing gear secure to fuselage.

Motor secure to fuselage.

Prop secure to shaft.

Motor connections secure.

ESC connected to receiver.

Are servos tight and connected to receiver?

Is rudder secured to fuselage?

Is elevator secured to fuselage?

Are ailerons secured to wing?

Is main wing secured properly and evenly to fuselage?

Visually check for anything loose on any control surfaces.

Are all electronics secured?

Are wind conditions favorable for flight?

Aircraft receiver batteries charged (gas or glow engines)?

Aircraft flight batteries charged (electric planes)?

**Transmitter batteries charged?** 

#### **Batteries Connected?**

Check rudder control for correct deflection.

Check elevator control for correct deflection.

Check ailerons control for correct deflection.

Do a preflight range check 90 feet at low transmitter output.

## **ACRC SAFETY**

Does your airplane, helicopter, quad copter, sailplane, paper airplane, Frisbee or whatever you fly have the proper identification required by the AMA to be covered for insurance for flying at the club field? It doesn't take much effort to make sure that you are covered. Yet, how many of us don't even bother.

At last years pattern contest I mentioned this obvious rule from the AMA. I thought that I would have been "preaching to the choir" on that I was truly surprised when several pilots came forward to borrow my label maker to make sure that they were in compliance with regulations.

Another thing that surprises me that it is overlooked at the club. It is easy to put your ID on your plane. Take the return address label off of your AMA magazine and tape it on to the flight battery or other internal part of the airplane. Not only will you be in compliance but it also may help you retrieve a lost airplane.

My dad built a P-51 some 25 years ago. It has never been flown but he did a clever bit of hiding some identification on the airplane. He put his phone number on the side of the airplane as the serial number for the airplane right on the tail. He wasn't a member of a club so it was not about identification for insurance purposes but I think he was being proactive to recover a lost model.

I hope that our instructors are passing this information on to the new pilots and I hope that our new pilots are furthering this information to any holdouts.

If anyone else has a clever idea about placing their information on an airplane I would love to hear about it. And, no, you don't need to identify and license your Frisbee, unless if course it has FPV.
