While I did buy skis for one of my planes, and I do have a baseball complex across the road, I don't see myself going out in the cold these days, cold is a lot colder as you get older. But let's talk flight simulators, no it isn't the real thing, but the Realflight systems are very good and once you get past the learning curve they are very realistic. First thing is a capable PC. It will run sufficiently on pretty much any system, but the better your system the better the results. A barebones \$200.00 system will run it with acceptable results. I just picked up a black Friday HP gaming laptop for \$500.00, with a quad core processor with 8 GB ram and a graphics driver with 3GB and it makes

the sim sing! Out of the box the system needs a few easy tweaks. First is to under physics, set skill lever to beginner, normal or custom. I run custom and slow down physics speed to about 80%, flight model to realistic and auto pilot to off. Next set the graphics to whatever level your PC can handle and start to fly! Also there are a few wireless interfaces available so you are not tethered to your PC, they run anywhere from \$30.00 for the spectrum wireless interface to as low as \$12.00 for the Orange version of the spectrum. That works as well as any. Bind to your flight radio (or a cheap second hand radio, save your sticks for the real thing) then once you get tired of flying on your tiny 15" laptop screen, plug in an HDMI cable and fly on your 70" widescreen! Now practice prophangers and flat spins with a plane that is repaired with the push of a button!

We did give away the Avios Grand Tundra at the November meeting! Congratulations to Darren Bitzer! Which brings us to our next Plane raffle. We will next be giving away a Phoenix Waco F5C biplane! It is a 63" WS ARF that will fly with electric, gas or glow and we will again be selling only 25 tickets @ \$20.00 ea. 


