THE APRIL MEETING IS ON ZOOM.

I hope you will take time to read the flying site rules and refresh your memory now that the flying season is close at hand. This is especially important because a few years ago some changes were made to rule 10 and high-speed passes are now allowed over the runway in certain instances. The rules will be attached to the email you get with this newsletter. You should print a copy and keep it handy. If someone mentions to you that you are violating one of the safety rules please do whatever it takes to correct what you are doing. It is considered bad form to give them a hard time and then continue doing what you are doing. If it means that you have to stop flying and make repairs or go home to get something that you need, that is what the club expects you to do. The AMA insurance for you and the landowner provides coverage only if you are following the rules. It would be a shame to lose our field because of the ignorance and arrogance of a few fliers.

Part of Rule #2 states that members are to put their membership card on the frequency board and guests are supposed to use their AMA card. The reason for this is so that we can be sure that the fliers are either current ACRC members or guests with a current AMA. Fliers are not to use last year's cards, driver's licenses or business cards. If you lose your 2021 ACRC card and need a new one let me know. I will mail you a new card -FREE.

Don't forget that the first Fun Fly of 2021 is on Saturday, April 17.

The next meeting will be on ZOOM on April 15 at 7:00 PM. This is the last indoor meeting until September. The summer meetings will be AT THE FIELD.

Paul Rono showed his new 16 channel Radio Master transmitter.

Stan Zdon showed his quarter-scale Balsa USA Fokker D-VIII. He has the guns painted and has finished putting the yellow stripes on the fuselage. Everything is covered now. When painting the guns, at first he tried dipping the guns in thinned out latex paint but it didn't adhere well to the plastic leaving it looking gray. He then sprayed the guns with Rust-Oleum semi-gloss black and that covered the entire outside and some of the inside. The finished guns attach to the airplane using strong magnets.

The wing is 82 inches long. It is covered with olive drab Oratex. Prior to covering the wood he applied a product from Sig called Stix-it. Because it is so thick he mixed it 50% with acetone to thin it and it soaks into the wood very well. The cowl has been primed and is ready to be painted black. It will be powered by a 4-stroke OS 120 Surpass.
