FROM THE VEEP

There is snow on the ground and building season is in full swing. I expect some of you have found time to get skis on your planes to take advantage of the milder winter days. I just picked up some materials to take a second attempt at making skis This time I purchased some for my trainer. aluminum sheet and rivets, so hopefully they will be sturdy and simple to build. I'm planning to (and please hold me to this) finish them before the Freeze-Fly coming up. I've attended a few such events and have always enjoyed watching touchand-goes off of the snow, but I've never had skis on my own planes, so I've just brought my handlaunch models. I'm determined to make it the year I finally have skis, maybe even on two planes if I can salvage the lite-ply attempt number-1 skis.

Regarding the building part of the season, sometimes one must improve the workshop before getting around to the models to build. One of the improvements I've made to mine over the last couple years is to make an airplane storage rack. It is rather simple, but requires the ability to screw 2x2's to the wall. I'm fortunate enough to have an unfinished basement for my shop and there is a

false wall that I was able to utilize for this. I spaced the 2x2's so that I had room for wings on one end and fuselages on the other. Then I took a 5/8" Forstner bit and drilled holes where necessary to custom fit the wings and fuselages on dowels cut to the right length. I've included a photo that hopefully makes it into the newsletter to show you how space efficient this can be. I have about 10 models situated on the wall, with the one open space being reserved for the Piper Cub's fuselage (the wing is already up there.) I also have plans to build worktable. bring а new so vour recommendations for what kind of top to utilize to our next club meeting.



We had some generous donations to the raffle pool at last months meeting, and I gave away the first of a handful of models. This month I plan to include a House of Balsa "Schoolyard Scale" Super Decathlon kit. With a 47" wingspan, it is intended for a .061 to .10 glow and it would be a good candidate for an electric conversion as well. Bring your friends, bring your build projects to show off, bring a favorite treat to share. It should be a great gathering, so see you there.
