It is a smaller size, only spanning 50 inches if it had proper wingtips and it appears to be from an ARF. I've had it further down on the list of priorities, but I planned to build a fuselage for it and equip it with a V-tail configuration. As I was perusing the RC Groups classified section (which I probably do too often) I found an ad for a Carl

Goldberg Eaglet kit, which has a 50-inch wingspan of all things. Furthermore, the kit was not complete and did not have the components to build a wing. I figured it was a match made in the skies for my wing, even though I had doubts that the wing chord would be the same.

I bought the kit and it made its way from Duluth the Lino Lakes in about a day. It must have seen some water damage earlier because only the top of the box was included and some of the lite-ply was warped. The chord of the wing is shorter than the design calls for, but I have some ideas to make it work. I promptly set out to build the fuselage and surprisingly had it mostly together in a couple of days. The interlocking parts helped to straighten each other out and make assembly easy. I'm hoping it won't be too hard to modify the tail section into a V-tail so that I can stick to my original plan. I think I will call it a V-Eaglet. I was happy to find the kit and give it a good home where it could be built and flown.

For those of you who came to last month's club meeting expecting to put your money down to win the Dollar Tree foam airplane/power pack, you may have been disappointed to find that it was not present. Instead, I raffled off a table top plane stand made by Ernst Manufacturing. During shipping, the power pack made it all the way to Maple Grove before it somehow got diverted. It ended up in Montanna, looping all the way to Fargo, North Dakota, getting delayed there due to the snow storm and finally back to Minneapolis several days later. The good news is this well-travelled prize package will be available at the upcoming club meeting.

The event is May 4, 2024 at the South St. Paul Fleming Airport from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Set up for exhibitors should begin about 9:00 a.m.

The event is going to feature full scale airplanes, flight simulators, drones, model rockets, a radar display, wind tunnel and hopefully many ACRC models. I believe there will be air rides. There will be more information to follow Jim Zurales (retired Delta Air Lines Captain and education leader of the MN Wing) is organizing the event and asked if ACRC members could bring their models for static display and demonstrations. ACRC has worked with Jim several times in the past and the CAP was always appreciative. We will be at an airport so there will be no outdoor flying allowed, however we would like as many static displays as possible and we plan to do some engine runs throughout the event. Also, I would like to have several laptop and/or desktop RC simulators set up to let the cadets try their hand at flying.
