I did bring a truck load of R/C stuff to the TCRC swap meet last week and had a great time and was pleased with the turn out.


I am still looking for a volunteer to supply a retrieve boat for the float fly in September. Please call me if you have the inkling to help me with that or know someone who might.

Editor's Note: Since we delayed the discussion on the By-Laws last month, I've once again included the following page 2 of this newsletter, which is dedicated to the proposed changes to the By-Laws. Please review them carefully and bring your comments and questions to the June club meeting.

IN THE BY-LAWS:

ARTICLE I Section 3 would change the Renewal deadline from January 1 to January 31. That doesn't mean that you have to re-new in January. You can re-new for the next year any time after September so, we have actually 5 months to re-new to keep your membership current. We need as many members as possible paid by January 31 so we can budget for events, Etc. It would also eliminate the \$5.00 late fee. It has been both a waste of time and a great hassle to chase down that \$5.00 for those that either forget to add it or ignore the line item on the application.

NEW ARTICLE I SECTION 3:

Members are responsible to pay membership dues on time and in full. New members must pay at the time of application. For new members joining after September 1, the dues will include the following year. Renewals are due on or before January 31st of each year.

ARTICLE I SECTION 4 would change (in a calendar year) to (by January 31st).

NEW ARTICLE I SECTION 4:

Membership in ACRC will terminate if there is no payment of dues by January 31st. If a member is dropped for any reason, reinstatement shall be on the same basis as a new member.

NEW MEMBERSHIP PAYMENT SCHEDULE:

MEMBERSHIP DUES	_\$75.00 (new member after Sep.1 will include following year
INITIATION FEE	_\$20.00 (new members and renewals after Jan. 31st
JUNIOR MEMBER DUES	\$25.00 (under 19 and parent not an ACRC member
FAMILY MEMBER DUES	\$5.00 (member's child under 19 or spouse
Runway donation_	Optional for future runway replacement

These changes will be read at the May June meeting and voted on at the June July meeting requiring a two-thirds vote of the attending members to pass.

Nominations for open board positions will be taken at the June membership meeting with elections occurring in July.


